SUMMARY

The Pharmacy Practice Residency Program at Trover Foundation is designed to promote the development of the clinician to perform independently and excel in clinical services in both inpatient and outpatient settings. The program will provide experiences to develop teaching, presentation and research skills in an environment with strong support from administrative, medical, nursing, and pharmacy staffs. The structure of the program is divided into twelve one-month rotations providing opportunities to strengthen pharmaceutical knowledge in the areas of acute care, ambulatory care, drug information and drug use policy development, and administration. Three elective rotations allow the resident to enhance clinical skills in particular areas of interest.

TROVER FOUNDATION

Trover Foundation had its beginnings in 1953 in a small clinic in Earlington with five physicians. Today it is the largest health care system in western Kentucky with a 410-bed hospital, a multi-specialty clinic housing 90 physicians in eight locations, a state-of-the art cancer center, and a sports medicine facility in four communities. The Education Division of Trover Foundation is the most well known, comprehensive health education system in rural Kentucky.

What makes Trover Foundation unique is its location. Madisonville is located in the heart of western Kentucky. It has a population of approximately 20,000 people. Health care and education are the two largest sectors of the economy. It is a progressive community using the slogan "Where High Tech Meets Hospitality" to attract newcomers to the community.
